Social Aid Evenues

The data are weighted by age, gender, race, and parish [county], to make the sample as representative as possible of Greater New Orleans. Still, the sample may not be fully representative of stayers/leavers, or of some particular communities and neighborhoods.

This survey was conducted by a variety of methods, in a variety of communities, over a substantial period to time (summer 2006 through spring 2011).

This long time period, in particular, should be kept in mind when interpretating results.

The results shown here are based on the questionnaire in use during 2009-2011.

Cells marked "a" are missing answers because the samples were collected before a particular question was used.

The following samples were asked during particular time periods:

Vietnamese: 2009

Jewish: 2006, with some questions repeated in 2010

Social Aid & Pleasure Club Members: 2009 Residents of Evacuee Trailer Villages: 2007

Other samples were conducted throughout the 2006-2011 period.
